India-Thailand Bilateral Relations

A. Introduction

- 1. India and Thailand, located in each other's extended neighborhood, share a maritime boundary in the Andaman Sea. India's bilateral relations with Thailand are rooted in history, age-old social and cultural interactions and extensive people to people contacts. A large Indian diaspora living and working in Thailand is another important bond.
- 2. Thailand plays an important role in various regional and sub-regional groupings. It is, therefore, an important partner for India in the India-ASEAN Summit Level Partnership, the East Asia Summit (EAS), the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC), the Mekong Ganga Cooperation (MGC), Asia Cooperation Dialogue (ACD) Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) and Ayeyawady-Chao Phraya-Mekong Economic Cooperation Strategy (ACMECS).

B. Commercial Relations (Trade and Foreign Investment) – Recent facts & figures

- 3. As per India's Foreign trade classification system, Thailand falls under Region 15: BIMSTEC countries as a trading partner and as per latest compiled and available statistics with DGCI&S database, India's exports to Thailand from April'23-January'24 have been recorded at USD 3.29 billion and India's imports from Thailand during the same period stands at USD 6.81 billion with a resultant trade balance deficit of 3.52 billion US Dollar.
- 4. Thailand views India as the gateway to South Asia and beyond. As a result of the reduced tariff rates and new initiatives adopted by both the countries, trade between two countries increased manifold in recent years. In 2020-21, despite the pandemic situation, the total trade figures stood at US\$ 9.91 billion. In 2022-23, it reached a record high of around US\$ 16.90 billion. An account of Bilateral commodities trade in goods from 2018-19 to 2022-23 are as under:
